Using one of the templates and pencil and tracking paper, track the pattern on each piece of cardboard; Cut. 2. Choosing a pumpkin to cut is important to put some thought into your pumpkin selection, but what exactly makes a good selection of pumpkins? The most important thing is that you are looking for that flesh not starting to go bad. Make sure the flesh is still solid, advises Natasha.When it comes to size and shape, large pumpkins with flat sides are easier to lay a stencil, but in fact it all comes down to your design. If I have a design that I really want to try, I'll print it and take that to the store with me, so I know I'm getting a pumpkin that's the appropriate shape. Before you can get on the carving, you have to prepare a pumpkin - and it's not all than just scooping the seeds cut on top, so you can hollow out and clean the inside, I do it in the sink to contain the mess, said Natasha. Many kits come with a handy pumpkin scraper that will help you get out the seeds, but it will also help you thin the walls of the pumpkin, she explained, continuing: Thin to a quarter of an inch, so that when you cut the blade goes all the way through and you get full cuts through the flesh. If you know which side you're going to cut, you don't need to lose weight all the way around. Marking your design on a pumpkin stencil design on a pumpkin is most often done by marking the design with lots of tiny holes. I print a stencil on a regular piece of paper, I tape it, and then my transfer tool looks like a giant push, says Natasha. Line your cut lines with punctures and then how to play play pumpkin dots. Natasha's top tip: Once you have the design transferred to the pumpkin, keep that stencil as a reference point because sometimes the dots all start to look like they're mixed together. Start cutting the pieces out of the design center and then work your way out to the pumpkin stable. If you're cutting inward it's going to make the pumpkin center really unstable,' she explained. If you're a right-handed man working yourself to the left, it's around right, so you never have a hand or wrist resting on a cut pumpkin - and vice versa. You can feel around which tool the kit works for you, but the general rule from Natasha: Use a large blade to cut through long big lines and then smaller blades for fine detail work. Natasha's top tip: Leave all the pieces until you've cut out anything that leaves more stability in the pumpkin, so you have less chance of breaking it. I believe you get a more intense glow and a warm glow from real candles, I usually put two tea lights in, Halloween Pumpkin DisplaysNatasha also has some clever tricks for arranging multiple pumpkins to create aesthetic displays. Vary the size of the pumpkin and vary the heights, she advises. I buy small bales of hay so I can vary the height of the pumpkin and I also use two steps up to my door to create some depth and height with my pumpkin display. Odd numbers look best. How long your pumpkin last depends on many factors including the pumpkin itself, how long you have it burns and weather. However, Natasha has some tips for them to last longer. To keep the pumpkins I keep them in the fridge or store them outside with a blanket on top. You definitely don't want it to sit inside at room temperature (as long as you display them). That's when you get pumpkin rot. Once you have cut out your design, rub the vaseline along all the cut lines. This will help give you another couple of days of moisture before Your pumpkin is starting to look wilted.
